Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Tidbit:

In our quest to help students understand and practice emotional regulation, we have landed on 3 areas of focus. Explicitly teaching and practicing emotional regulation strategies, teaching mindfulness and establishing a gratitude practice. While we are still responsible as adults to help students regulate their emotions, by modeling and helping students feel gratitude, we are teaching them about things that are within their control and growing their emotional intelligence.

Three Steps to Practice Gratitude:

- 1. Notice good things, look for them, appreciate them.
- 2. Savor, absorb, and really pay attention to those good things.
- **3.** Express your gratitude to yourself, write it down, or thank someone.



Math Tip for Parents

Practice measurement at home:

- ·Cook with your child and have them help measure ingredients
- ·Have your child estimate distances and then measure them using rulers, tape measures, or your car odometer.
- ·If you are traveling, map your trip before you go, looking at distances between destinations.

Reading Tip for Parents

Picture This! During your next outing or gathering, take action-packed photos, then have your child create captions to go with each picture. Assemble the pictures and captions in a picture book or album, and add speech and thought bubbles to create a personalized – and probably hysterical – graphic novel.

Communication Matters:

Top Ten ways to improve communication skills at home...

#2 DON'T OVER CORRECT YOUR CHILD

If you demand that your child say a sound correctly, especially if it is a sound that doesn't develop until they are older.....please stop! Make sure they view you as a guide and support, not a speech patrol officer. Choose a time, such as reading together, when you can practice and talk about it being the goal right then.

#3 TREAT YOUR CHILD AS A FULL COMMUNICATION PARTNER

Talking with children like an adult doesn't mean use adult vocabulary, jokes, or information they won't understand. It means **take turns**, **use eye contact**, **and value what they say**.
