

AP INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMA

Students wishing to challenge themselves and gain a broader worldview may become AP International Diploma candidates.



To earn this distinction, a student must:

1. Designate on at least one exam that their score should be sent to an international university
2. Earn scores of three or higher in the following areas:
 - Two AP exams from two different languages, one of which is English
 - One AP exam from World History, Human Geography, or Government and Politics: Comparative
 - One AP exam in science or math
 - One or two AP exams from any content area except English and world languages

The AP program at Mountain View High School offers an opportunity for our students to challenge themselves with college level courses. The rigor of these courses prepares our students to meet their college ambitions and provide an opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school.

Mountain View is committed to preparing our students with the knowledge, skills, confidence, and personal integrity to meet the challenges of college level courses. Whether a freshman or a senior, when students choose to take AP classes they will receive rigorous instruction.

Our **AP Scholar Awards Program** recognizes high school students who have demonstrated college-level achievement through AP courses and exams. All AP courses are graded on a 5.0 scale. This achievement is acknowledged on any AP score report sent to colleges.

The granting college or university determines the amount of college credit granted. The AP exams are developed by the College Board and given nationally.

Become an AP Scholar

AP Scholar – score of 3 or higher on 3 AP exams.

AP Scholar with Honor – average of 3.25 on all AP exams taken and scores of 3 or higher on 4 or more of these exams.

AP Scholar with Distinction – average of 3.5 on all AP exams taken and a score of 3 or higher on 5 or more exams.
