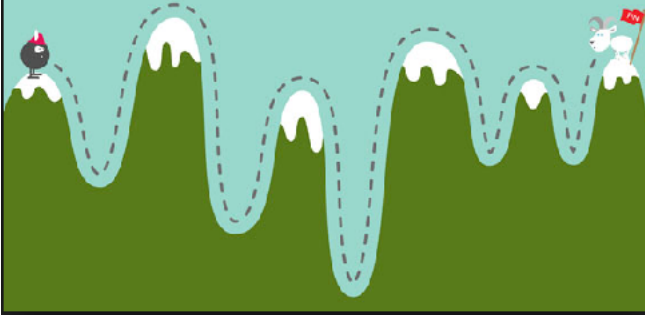

Do you know a child that will be 5 before September 1st, 2018? We are registering now for next year's kindergarten class. Family Tips

A growth mindset is something that can be learned and developed. You can help your child develop empathy by doing the following:

- While reading a picture book with your child, talk about the characters' feelings. Ask questions like; How do you think that character is feeling? Why do you think that? If the character is sad or upset ask; What can that character do to feel better? How did another character help?
- You can do the same things when watching a movie. Discuss how the character is feeling and how you can tell.
- Talk about how to make amends. Everyone makes mistakes. It's a part of life. But if your child did something to cause someone's upset, what can he or she do to make it better?

Subject: Changes in the La Pine School Zone

Dear parent/guardian,

I'm writing to let you know of exciting changes taking place in downtown La Pine that will improve the safety of your child getting to school. The city of La Pine and Oregon Department of Transportation have partnered on a project to make La Pine safer and more walkable, with new sidewalks, bike lanes, paving, street trees and other amenities through the downtown core.



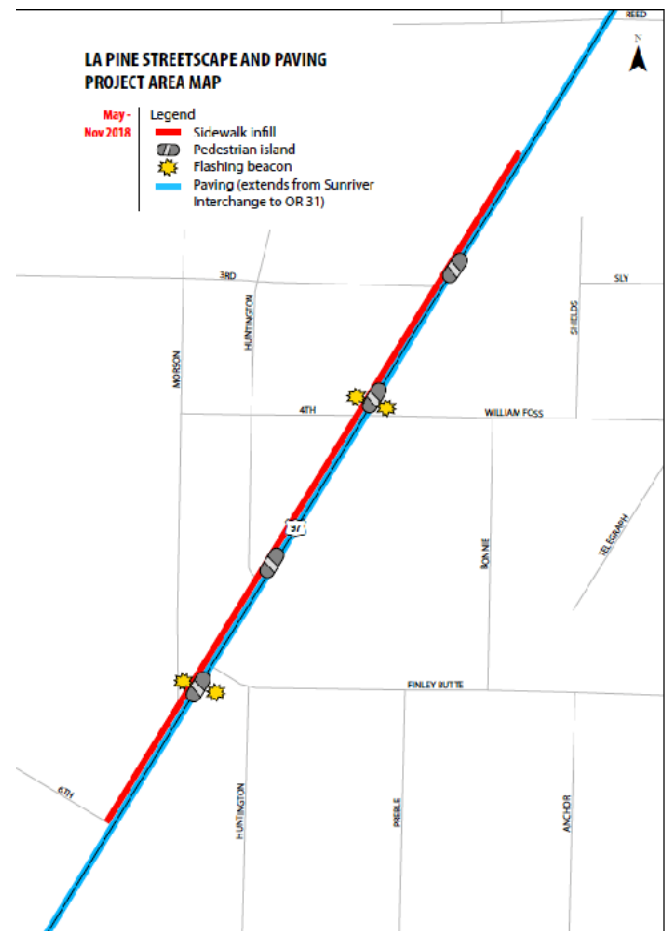
Construction of these improvements will begin this summer. This project will create continuous, safe sidewalk access on the west side of US 97 between 3rd Street and 6th Street and will enhance crossings that connect schools with residences east of the highway.

Crossing improvements will be constructed across US 97 at its intersection with 3rd Street, 4th Street/William Foss Road, Huntington Road, and Finley Butte Road. Improvements will include:

- New crosswalks at all four intersections defined by pedestrian refuge islands between northbound and southbound lanes to allow pedestrians to cross one direction of traffic at a time.
- Pedestrian activated flashing beacons at the intersections of US 97 and 4th Street/William Foss Road and Finley Butte Road to alert drivers of pedestrians at the crossings.
- Improved lighting at each crossing.

With these improvements, the Bend/La Pine School District, city and ODOT have worked cooperatively to remove the existing La Pine School Zone that includes overhead and school zone speed flashing signs. The new pedestrian safety upgrades will not only promote safe crossing for children during school times, it will also benefit the safety of pedestrians for after hour events including football games, evening school activities and weekend events.
