**VEHICLES ON DISTRICT PROPERTY**

Regulating the use of vehicles on district property is necessary for the safety of students, staff and visitors.

Consistent with Oregon Revised Statutes, the following rules shall be posted and enforced, as applicable, at each school site:

1. A speed limit of 10 m.p.h. on district property;
2. City and state laws must be obeyed;
3. Vehicles are to be parked in clearly marked spaces and/or areas;
4. Vehicles are not to be parked in spaces or areas posted "staff," "visitor," "handicapped," "release" or other restricted spaces and/or areas unless parked by persons meeting the restriction and/or the vehicle is properly marked with a permit;
5. Vehicles are not to be parked in areas posted "no parking" or in areas posted as loading zones, bus zones, fire lanes or other similarly designated areas. School buses, emergency vehicles, maintenance and delivery vehicles are exempt from this rule, as appropriate;
6. Vehicles are not to be driven over or around curbs or other physical barriers. Emergency and maintenance vehicles are exempt from this rule;
7. Vehicles shall not be operated in an unsafe manner, including careless driving, reckless driving or transporting another person in such a manner that the rider is not protected by the structure of the vehicles and/or does not have access to a seat belt system;
8. Vehicles shall not be operated in a manner that damages or alters district property including, but not limited to, driving on campus lawns;
9. Students will not use vehicles to knowingly transport another student off campus who does not have permission to leave;
10. Once a vehicle is appropriately parked on a school campus in a "non-release" area, it is not to be driven during school hours without the permission of a school administrator or designee;
11. Student vehicles on campus may be searched and property therein seized by district personnel if such search and seizure is supported by reasonable suspicion.

"Vehicles" as used in this policy includes all motor vehicles as defined in Oregon Revised Statutes and every other mechanical device in or on which a person or thing is or may be carried and which is intended for such use, consistent with Oregon Revised Statutes.

District administrators and their designees may request assistance from peace officers to enforce the rules listed above.

The superintendent will represent the district in any agreement or contract with any municipal corporation or any agency, department or political subdivision of this state for the purpose of providing a uniform system of enforcement of the rules listed above.
