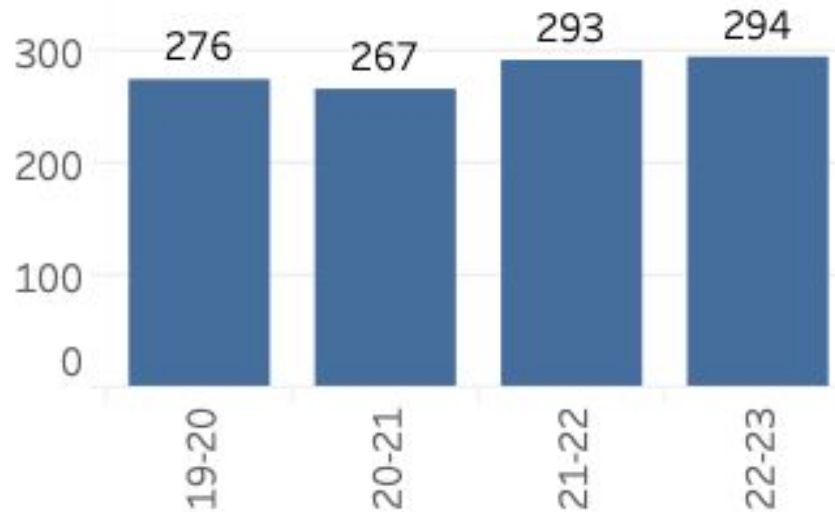
MVHS Fun Facts

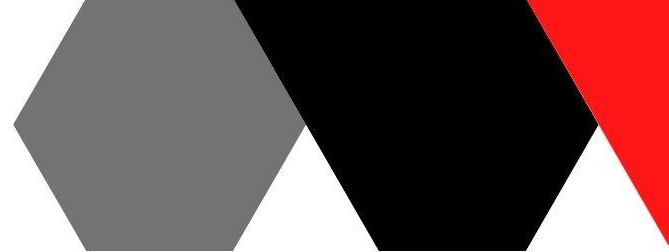

FORECASTING PROCESS



Step 1



Review the MVHS Curriculum Guide



Step 2



Discuss course placements with current teachers and family



Step 3



Enter your selections in StudentVUE (*PBMS due 3/15, SVMS due 3/17*) or fill out the Google Form (*all others*)



Step 4



Verify 7.5 credits for your primary courses and a minimum of 5 alternate choices

FORECASTING POLICIES

There will not be any schedule changes next year. You are expected to attend and complete the courses that you forecasted for and are scheduled in.

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Schedule changes will NOT be made for the following reasons: teacher preference, to be with friends, or you changed your mind.

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Class changes may only occur within the first week for the following reasons: open period or wrong placement/level.

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Drop Policy: after the first 10 days, students will receive a transcribed "F" grade.

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***Choose a minimum of 7.5 credits for your primary courses.

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***Choose a minimum of 5 alternative courses.
