


## Participate in the International Baccalaureate Programme

- Take one or more IB courses (graded on a 5.0 scale).
- Aim for an IB Certificate and potential college credit by completing all IB assessments in the course.
- Pursue the IB Diploma by taking courses in six IB subjects and completing IB Programme requirements of Theory of Knowledge, Extended Essay, and Creativity-Action-Service.

<u>Did you know?</u> Students at Bend High School can receive numerous college credits through IB scores, AP scores, Dual credit opportunities, and Expanded Options Program. Whether a student receives a few credits or 40+ credits depends on student performance and college policies.

### Preparing for IB in Grade 9 Sample Student Schedule & Explanations

To be best prepared for the Year 1 and Year 2 portion of the Diploma Program, 9<sup>th</sup> grade students should be prepared to take the following schedule. Students are required to take courses in Language Arts, Modern World History, Language Acquisition (Spanish, Heritage Spanish, or French), Mathematics, and Science.

#### Grade 9 Pathways:

The International Baccalaureate course work and Diploma Program officially begin in the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade year. However, at Bend Senior High School there are several pathways that will help students develop the skills they need to be successful in the IB DP coursework.

**Humanities:** For history and literature, the best plan is to sign up for Modern World History Honors and Literature and Composition I Honors. These courses will begin to introduce the analytical foundation, and historical foundation needed for understanding global humanities on a deeper level.

**Math:** Students typically begin in Algebra I or Geometry; however, if these classes were taken in 8<sup>th</sup> grade, students may choose to jump to Algebra II. In this path, students may begin accessing IB math courses their sophomore year.

Science: 9<sup>th</sup> grade science at Bend High is designed in year 9 to give students a base in both biology and physics. In the next year, students will then begin to develop their base in chemistry. This base is important for students' success in IB Chemistry, IB Physics, and / or IB Biology. Students interested in the IB pathway should sign up for Bio/ Physics their freshman year.

**Foreign Language:** Spanish and French are the two languages offered at Bend High School. Year 9 students should plan to sign up for Spanish II / French II as freshman; however, students will need to sign up for the language that sequentially fits past experience. If level I coursework is needed, there will be other avenues the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade year to make sure students are on track for IB graduation.

\*\*We encourage all students to take the most rigorous coursework that they are ready for. At Bend High, counseling and IB coordinators will work with students on an individual basis if there are concerns around classes that a student may not be ready for in their 9<sup>th</sup> grade year\*\*

### Preparing for IB in Grade 10 Sample Student Schedule & Explanations

To be best prepared for the Year 1 and Year 2 portion of the Diploma Program, 10<sup>th</sup> grade students should be prepared to take the following schedule. Students are required to take courses in Language Arts, Modern World History, Language Acquisition (Spanish, Heritage Spanish, or French), Mathematics, and Science.

#### Grade 10 Pathways:

The International Baccalaureate course work and Diploma Program officially begin in the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade year. However, at Bend Senior High School there are several pathways that will help students develop the skills they need to be successful in the IB DP coursework.

**Humanities:** For history and literature, the best plan is to sign up for IB Prep U.S. History and IB Prep English 10. These courses will continue to introduce the analytical, and historical foundation needed for understanding global humanities on a deeper level. As well as introduce different techniques to analyze different types of sources, which is imperative for IB exams in Y1 / Y2 of the IB program.

**Math:** Students will use Algebra II as a starting point to access the IB math analysis and IB math application classes their junior year. These classes may be accessed in Year 10 as long as students have met the prerequisite requirements.

Science: Students in year 10 begin to develop their base in chemistry. This base is important for students' success in IB Chemistry, IB Physics, and / or IB Biology, depending on what IB classes students sign up for. Students interested in the IB pathway should sign up for Chemistry I their sophomore year.

**Foreign Language:** Spanish and French are the two languages offered at Bend High School. Year 10 students should plan to sign up for the next sequential language class. It is important that students are signed up for either Spanish or French class. We will work with students on language placement so they are prepared to take IB exams their junior / senior year.

\*\*We encourage all students to take the most rigorous coursework that they are ready for. At Bend High, counseling and IB coordinators will work with students on an individual basis if there are concerns around classes that a student may not be ready for in their 10<sup>th</sup> grade year\*\*
